Here's another combination that makes A say its name.

say	ray	may	pay
lay	day	hay	way
away	tray	clay	play
pray	today	holiday	gray

Today is a gray day, but I want to play.

Bring clay on a tray and we'll play.

(“We’ll” means we will. The apostrophe separates the WE from the Ls. You don’t read the word as “well.” You read WE and then add the L sound.)

I will pay the way for us on the train.

Let’s go away for the holiday.

Pray for a better way.

Saying “please” is polite manners.

She is learning to lay the hay for the animals.

A word to learn with the A sound is they.
