
















Harriet Tubman

Cut around the outside on the dark black line to make one large square. Cut the other dark black lines and stop when they stop (one rectangle from the outside edge). Fold the book like an accordion on the lighter lines, folding the page up or down when you get to a new row to continue the accordion.

<p>She even helped newly freed slaves find work.</p> 	<p>Travelling secretly by night, she is said to have "never lost a passenger."</p> 	<p>She guided dozens of slaves to freedom on the Underground Railroad, earning the nickname "Moses."</p> 	<p>She soon returned to Maryland to rescue her family from slavery.</p> 
 <p>Tubman met John Brown and helped him plan his raid on Harper's Ferry.</p>	 <p>Tubman worked for the Union Army in the Civil War.</p>	 <p>She started as a cook and a nurse.</p>	 <p>She went on to become an armed scout and spy.</p>
