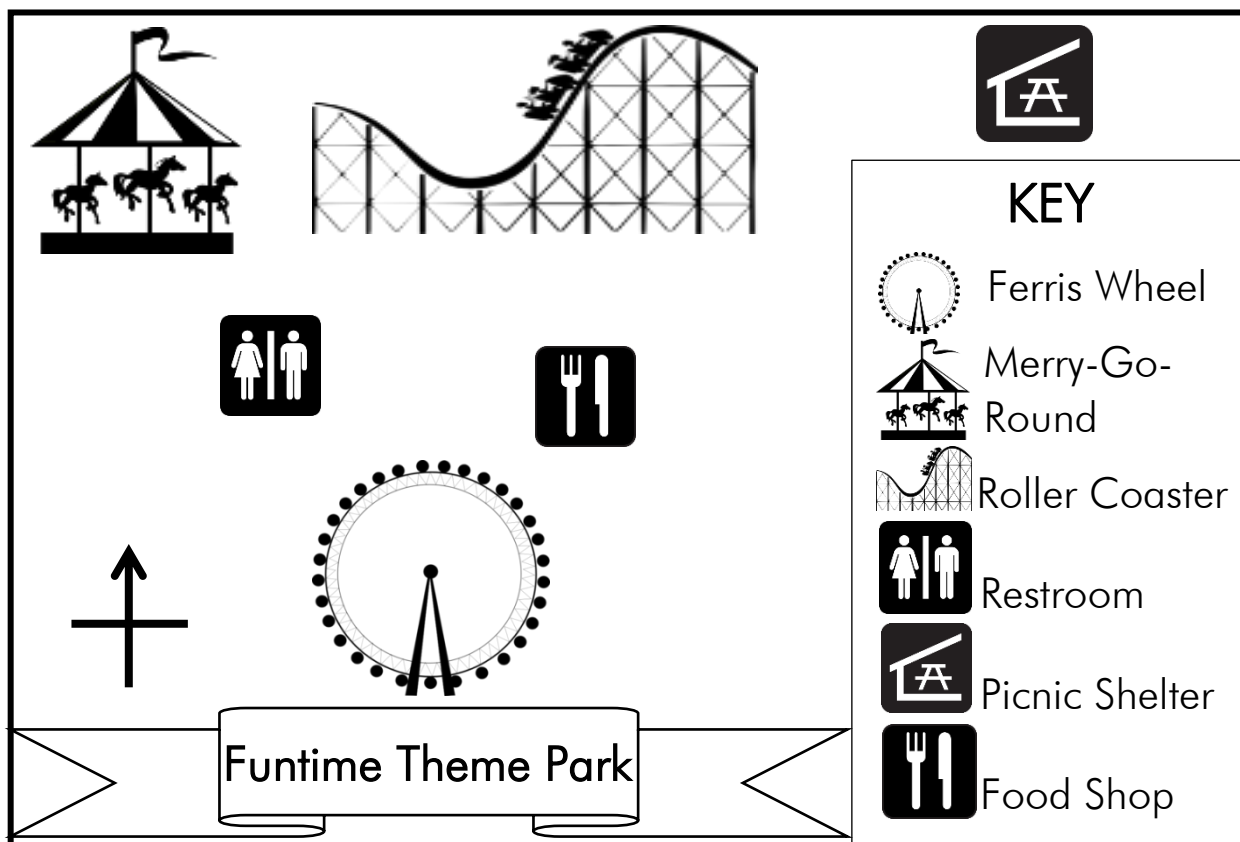


The largest room of the floor plan is the garage. This family has turned it into a **GAME ROOM**. Label it and draw what you would want in your game room.

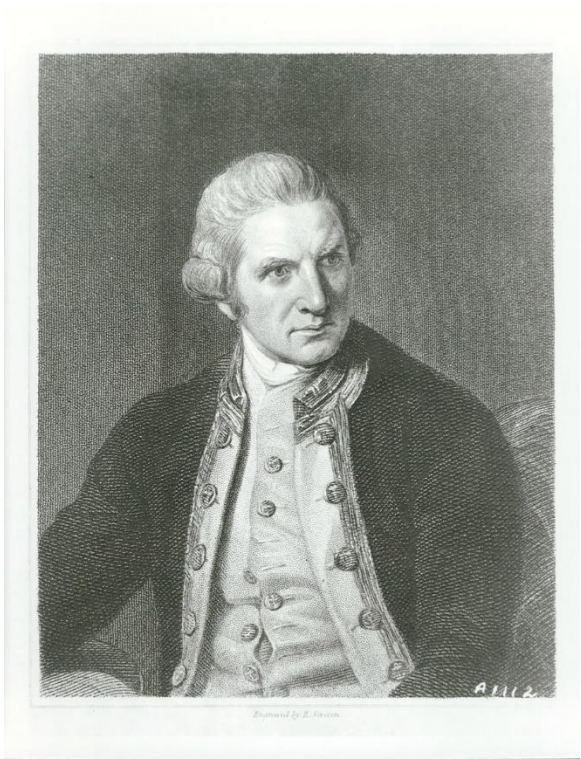
The current flag of Nigeria was chosen in 1959 from a redesign contest. It is made up of two outer green bands, representing the fertile land of Nigeria, and a middle white band that represents peace and unity.

Nigeria celebrated its independence from Britain on October 1, 1960. The Union Jack was lowered, and the new Nigerian flag was raised for the first time.

Turkey is a large and ancient country. Some say even part of the Garden of Eden was located there. In fact several parts of the Bible can be mapped in Turkey, including Mount Ararat where Noah's ark landed.

Turkey is a "bridge" from Europe to Asia. The city of Istanbul is divided by water and part of the city stands on each continent.

Turkey has always been a desirable country because it is surrounded on many sides by water. It has a long history of being invaded. Turkey became a Muslim nation when the Ottomans attacked and took control in 1299.

The language in Turkey is called Turkish. Their money is called the Turkish Lira. One lira is about 65 cents. This is their new money. They recently changed from their old system where one dollar equaled more than one million lira!

## Lentil Soup

One onion  
One carrot, grated  
One cup red lentils  
Tomato paste  
Salt

Chop onion. Cook in a tablespoon of oil for a few minutes. Add a tablespoon of tomato paste. Continue to stir for a couple minutes. Pour in six cups of water. Add red lentils and grated carrot. Cover and boil over low heat about an hour. Salt to taste.

## Green Beans

Two onions  
Three tomatoes  
One pound of beans cut into 1-inch pieces  
Two heads of garlic  
One third cup olive oil  
One teaspoon both salt and sugar

Slice onion and tomato thinly. Cover bottom of pan with beans. Spread onion and tomato slices on top of beans. Add chopped garlic. Pour over oil and 1/3 cup hot water. Sprinkle over salt and sugar. Cover and boil over low heat for about an hour.

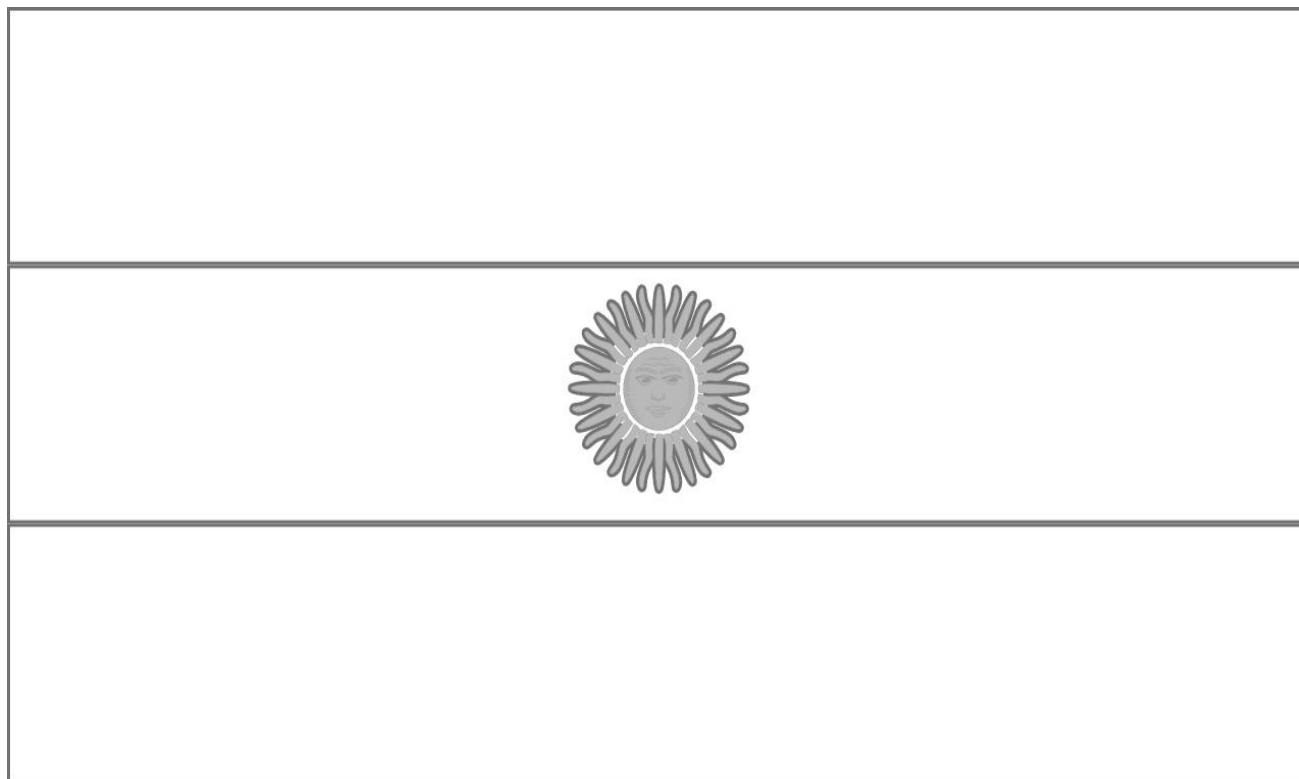
**teem:** to be full of things; The Amazon River is teeming with life means that there are many things living in it, like piranhas!

The Amazon River is the second longest river in the world, but it dumps more water into the ocean than any other river. It has more than one thousand branches to it and is **teeming** with life. Some parts of the river are light colored and some are dark because of the ground where the rivers form. When a "white" branch of the river meets a "black" branch of the river, the two colors run side by side for miles before mixing together.



## Argentine Flag

The Argentine flag has three equal horizontal stripes colored light blue on top and bottom and white in the middle. The center of the white band contains a golden sun known as the “Sun of May” which was based on the design of the first Argentine coin. This flag was first flown in 1812 during the War for Independence from Spain. It was adopted as the national flag in 1816, and the “Sun of May” was added in 1818.

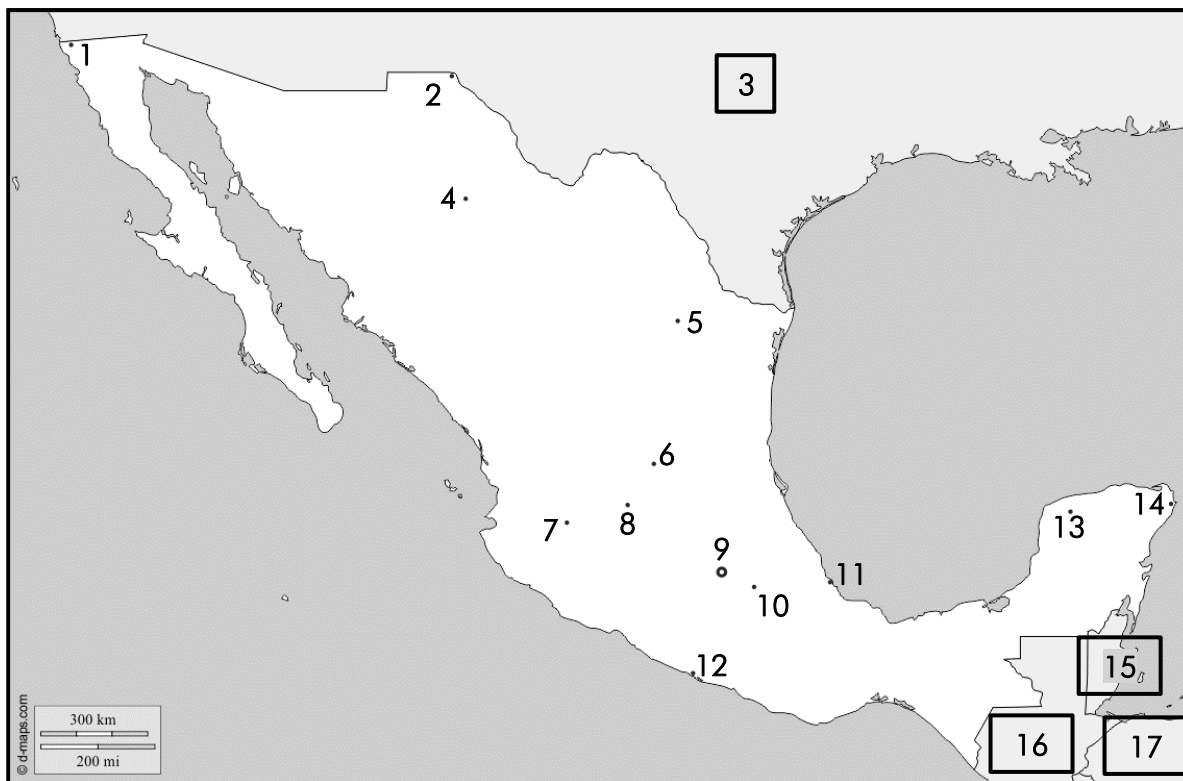

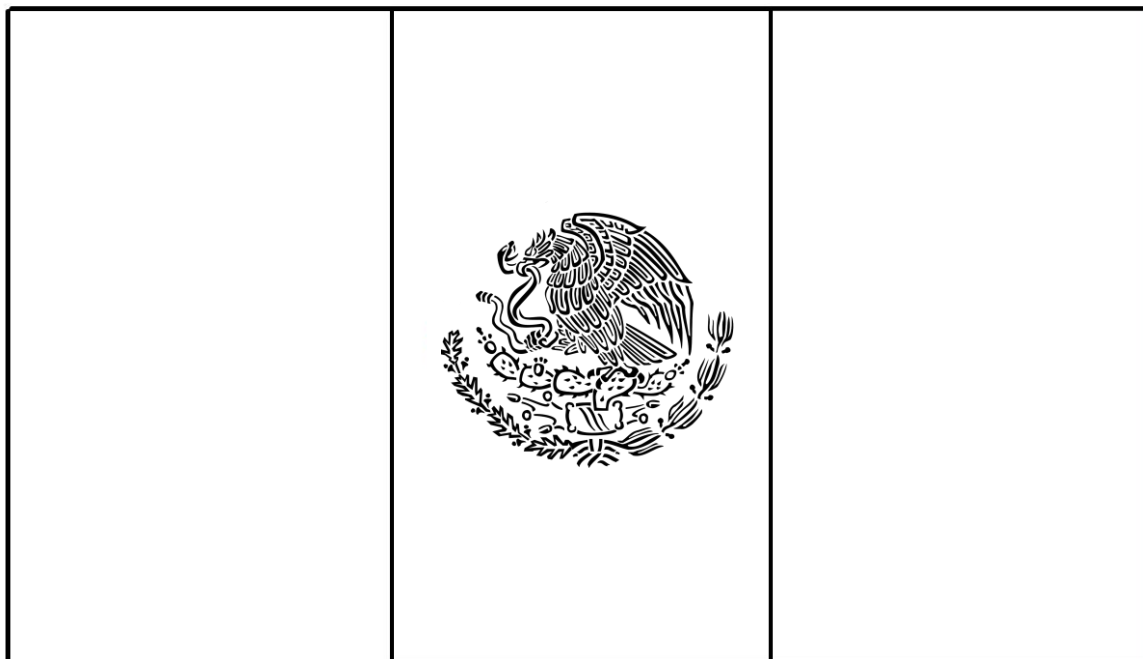

## Mexican Flag

The Mexican flag has three equal horizontal stripes colored green, white, and red from left to right. The center of the white band contains a coat of arms with an eagle perched on a cactus and holding a serpent. Aztec legend tells the tale of a nomadic leader having a dream of coming across an eagle perched on a cactus eating a snake. They were to build a city there. The city is now Mexico City. This flag wasn't officially adopted until 1968, though it's been around since 1821.

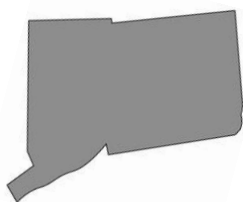


The flag of the United States of America, nicknamed “The Stars and Stripes” or “Old Glory,” has thirteen stripes, symbolizing the thirteen original colonies. Seven of the stripes are red, signifying the blood that was shed for independence, and six of the stripes are white, standing for purity and innocence. There are 50 white stars, representing the 50 current states. They are on a field of blue, standing for perseverance and justice.

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The White House, another landmark in Washington, D.C., is the home of the President of the United States.

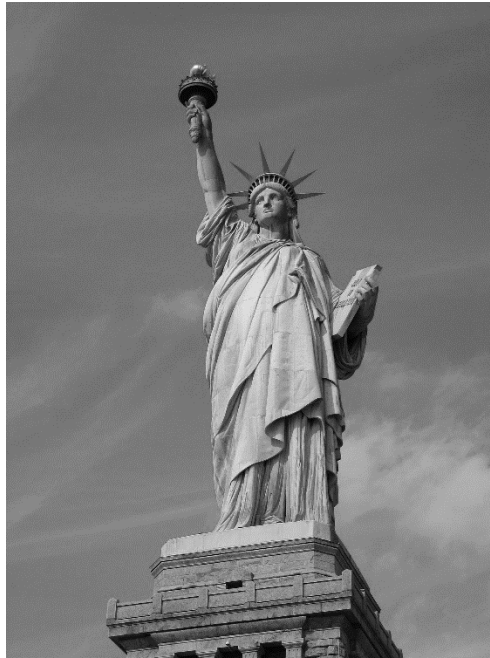

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The Empire State Building is famous for having been the tallest building in New York City for so long.



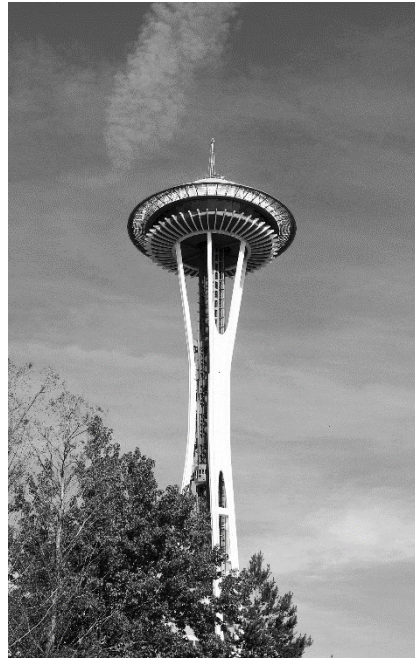
Most famously rung upon the first public reading of the Declaration of Independence; the Liberty Bell is on display in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania.
